## What do you need?

- ☒ Valid library card from a participating Wisconsin public library
- ☒ Computer
- ☒ Free software downloads
  - OverDrive Media Console (3.0 or newer recommended)
  - Windows Media Player 9 or higher and security patch
  - Adobe Digital Editions (to download ebooks)
- Optional software
  - iTunes (9 or newer) if transferring items to an iPod or iPhone
  - Zune software (3.0 firmware and software) if transferring items to a Zune
  - Any other software required by your portable device
- ☒ Optional – a portable device
  - All items can be listened to, watched, or read on your computer

- ☒ Visit [dbooks.wplc.info](http://dbooks.wplc.info) and browse collection
- ☒ Check out an item
  - Choose your library system (we're in South Central Library System)
  - Enter your library barcode number
- ☒ Download item
- ☒ Listen to, watch, or read on your computer **OR**
- ☒ Transfer to a portable device **AND**
- ☒ Enjoy!



## Helpful Hints

- ☒ Check out up to six (6) items
- ☒ Place up to five (5) items on hold
- ☒ Reached your maximum of items checked out and on hold? Add items to your wish list!
- ☒ Items returned automatically
- ☒ No late fees
- ☒ Check-out periods
  - ebooks and audio books, 7 or 14 days
  - music and videos, 3, 5, 7 or 14 days
