

 <p>Staple here</p>		<p><b>Instructions:</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Print bookmark page below onto parchment type paper (or just white)</li> <li>2. Cut out bookmarks (the long, skinny columns) along solid line borders.</li> <li>3. Cut the top row of “Mystery Tea” boxes off and fold each pair in half. This is your tea bag tag.</li> <li>4. Using the example to the left as your approximate guide, fold the booklist in half, right-sides together at center dashed line. Then, leaving that crease intact, fold on the lighter dotted lines blank sides together (so that the finished product, if viewed from the side looks like a tall, skinny “W”).</li> <li>5. Snip the corners at the top (similar to the pattern at left)</li> <li>6. Staple a small string at the top between the papers.</li> <li>7. Staple the bottom edge of the tea bag tag over the loose end of the string.</li> <li>8. Does it look sort of like a tea bag? You’ve done it correctly!</li> <li>9.
