## Lily and Dunkin by Donna Gephart

Dunkin is new to Florida and worried that his past troubles have followed him. He's finally in charge of taking his own bipolar medications, but still feels like his life is out of his control. When Dunkin comes across the path of a pretty girl with shimmering blue eyes one summer day, he has a sliver of hope that 8<sup>th</sup> grade won't be so bad.

Lily Jo McGrother loves to wear dresses and paint her nails. But, if she looked like this in school, she'd be afraid of what the Neanderthals in her 8<sup>th</sup> grade class would do to her. They already shove her into her locker, call her cruel names, and tease her for being "gay," though it's not the truth. Lily is simply a girl born into a boy's body, and most everyone knows her as Tim.

When a cute, tall boy walks past Lily's house and smiles at her, she's encouraged that someday she may be allowed to be her true self.

*"I lift my arm and wave, entirely aware that I'm wearing my mom's red dress and sandals. Hello, Idiot.*

*From the corner of my eye, I see the vein in Dad's temple pulse.*
