- 1. What's new and/or innovative at your library?

 Pam was very happy to announce that the library is now fully staffed. This has been a struggle for the library over the past 24 months, with multiple vacancies. With Pam's retirement in a few weeks, she is extremely happy to hand off the library with a fully trained staff.
- 2. What are the next projects (big or small) on your library's to-do list in the coming year? Reviewing and updating the library's strategic plan. Pam will be handing this off to the new director, but has discussed expanding the library's makerspace activities, the purchase of more equipment for this space and planned programming.
- 3. What challenges or concerns is your library facing now and in the near future? Space is always an issue. There is some pre-planning being completed in Cross Plains across multiple departments discussing new buildings and expansion. The idea for library expansion is if a new aquatic center is built to replace the community outdoor pool, the library would take the old pool property and add an addition onto the library. Also, all of the department heads in Cross Plains are putting together a new graded step salary structure for all municipal workers to raise salaries that will help keep employees long term.
