- 1. What's new and/or innovative at your library?
 - New Bookmobile for MID!
 - o will be the same size as the Dream Bus
 - o will focus on the Middleton area and support community outreach
 - o patrons will be able to pick up holds and return items, there will also be a "Lucky Day" collection
 - Next Level remodeling/rebranding project
 - o Color scheme (orange, purple, green)
 - o Repurposed Friends area for public space
 - o Working on adding more play structures in the children's area
 - Made the computer lab larger (basement)
 - o More free-standing PCs throughout the space for patrons
 - Wireless printing
 - Programming Team Summer Reading Program was for all ages (intergenerational literacy)
 - Working on Organization Chart
 - o Beloit Public Library did a presentation (WAPL and Wild Wisconsin) on their reorganization and it gave them the idea
 - They are in year 2 of this plan and currently working on revising all job descriptions

 - o Amy is going to the Bookmobile and Outreach Conference in PA
 - o Sarah and Amy are working on the collections that will be offered
 - Currently working on new policies/procedures

 - They are working with their Friends of the library group to fundraise with a \$50,000 goal
