If/when installed, Jodi wants to use this project as an educational tool, to teach the community about renewable energy. She hopes to install a meter inside the library to show patrons the savings. The library will be having a site visit within the next couple of weeks to explore what type of panels will work. Jodi is also installing a solar bench.

Bookmobile – Another section of Poynette's strategic plan is to add a bookmobile. Poynette does have a small committee for this project, but it has been put on hold due to the lack of vehicles available for purchase. The local dealership is keeping an eye out if anything comes available.

Jodi considered continuing curbside services, but currently patrons want to come into the library instead.
