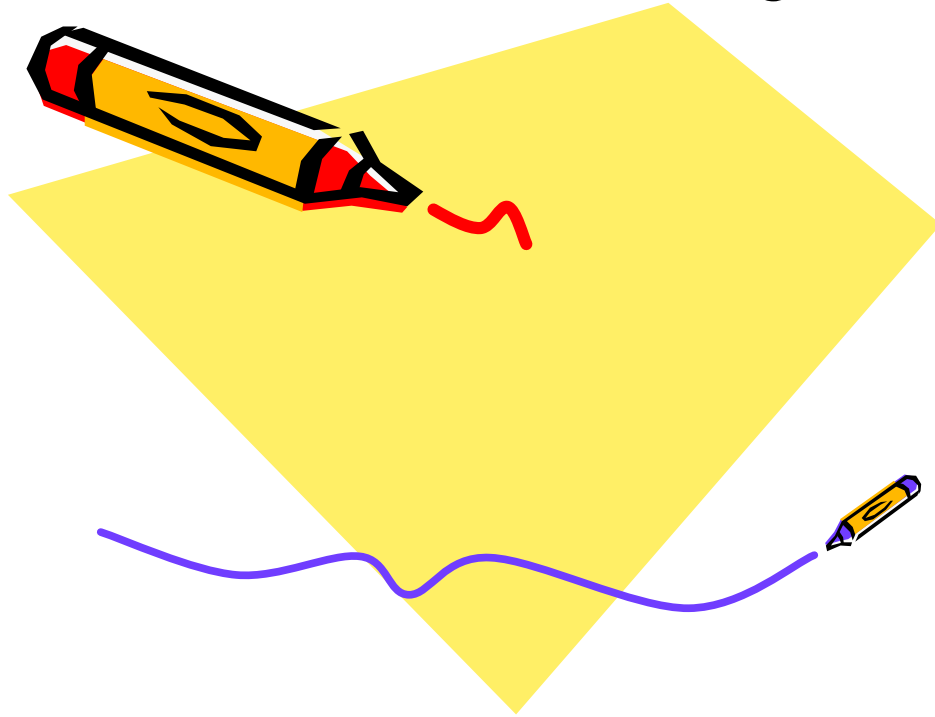

DePaola, Tomie. *Tomie's Baa, Baa, Black Sheep and Other Rhymes.* G.P. Putnam's Sons, 2004. *A Board book collection of four classic Mother Goose rhymes, suitable for lap sharing or reading aloud in a program.*

Ellwand, David. *Tickle Teddy, A Touch and Feel Book.* Brooklyn, N.Y.: Handprint Books, 2002. *A visceral experience for baby and grownup, as they tickle and touch teddy.*

Gentieu, Penny. *Baby! Talk!* New York: Crown Publishers, 1999. *With little text but lots of photos of adorable babies, this is always a winner.*

Taylor, Ann. *Baby Dance.* Illustrated by Marie Van Heerden. Harper Growing Tree. New York: HarperFestival, 1999. *Baby and Daddy find all kinds of ways to swoop high, low and around as they dance around the house.*

Thomas, Joyce Carol. *You Are My Perfect Baby.* Illustrated by Nneka Bennet. Harper Growing Tree. New York: HarperFestival, 1999. *An ode to every little part of baby, from nose to toes, and all of it perfect.*
