Programs include:

Wisconsin Works (W2) – Wisconsin’s TANF (Temporary Aid for Needy Families) program, provides cash assistance for families, while participants prepare and apply for work.

FSET (FoodShare Employment and Training) - Provides food assistance through FoodShare to families while participants prepare and gain job skills.

Emergency Assistance - Assists families who’ve had- or are- in danger of having utilities to their home shut off.

Job Access Loan (JAL) – Provides up to \$1600 in a no interest loan for work-related needs.
