- It's fun for us, too!



### **Story Element Considerations**



#### **Quantitative:**

- # of participants
- # of programs
- # of books, pages, time

#### **Qualitative:**

- Personal quotes from participants, staff, and partners
- Program photos
- Artwork

#### Who is benefitting from CSLP?

#### Children

92,021 participated in summer library programs

192,180 individuals participated in 5,299 summer library program themed events for children

#### Teens

10,650 participated in summer library programs

8,578 individuals participated in 1,362 summer library program themed events for teens

#### Adults

6,808 participated in summer library programs

5,772 individuals participated in 489 summer library program themed events for adults



### Imagine Your Story: Planning


- Start early

  - Each other





#### The Fine Print: Rules of Use

#### **Permitted Use:**

- Paper items
- Marketing materials
- One of a kind items, such as food items
- Programming activities
- Web sites, social media, professional media (TV marketing)
- Use copyright embedded images whenever possible.
- Using the slogan wording on non-paper products (such as promotional announcements, videos, etc.)

#### Restricted/Prohibited:

- Only to be used by public libraries
- No alteration to images other than changing the size.
- Do not remove the <sup>™</sup> symbol from the slogan.
- No use of CSLP art on items similar to products offered for sale by CSLP
  - Exception: paper goods (reading record, certificates, etc.)


#### Theme 1: Once Upon a Time


**Outcome:** To introduce early math skills, numbers, time, daily rituals and routines, etc.










### A Parade of Elephants storytime extenders:


#### Theme 2: Love Stories


**Outcome:** Participants will explore their emotions and positively connect with stories, literacy, and the library.



- Involve teen volunteers






Theme 3: Take a Breath

**Outcome:** Participants will learn new concepts through the familiar sense of self and breath.






Theme 4: Kittens, Mittens, and Pie


Outcome: To introduce children to healthy habits and to build cooperation skills.



- Provide a clothesline






#### Theme 5: Nursery Rhyme Time


**Outcome:** To introduce children to phonological awareness - the words we use are made up of different sounds.










Tracing Gingerbread Kid Cutters

- Use for displays, registration






Theme 6: My Story




