It is a stabilizing fiscal factor for SCLS and staff needs to take lead as oversight for statewide delivery transitions to the Wisconsin Public Library Consortium. It would be an advantage to the state and SCLS, if the installation of an automated sorting system could have its funding underwritten by the state and WPLC in partnership with SCLS. Cybersecurity should be an on-going and important project for SCLS and its members.

LINKCat software will be subject to a deep review over the next 2 years. It needs to be integrated with OverDrive and other databases.

The success of SCLS can be traced back to its collaborative management team and giving all staff the space and support to try new concepts and possibly crazy ideas. SCLS is a leader and innovator and that is because of its staff being proactive and not reactive.
